Call to Worship

Scripture Reading - Ephesians 6:10-20

Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm. Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness, and, as shoes for your feet, having put on the readiness given by the gospel of peace. In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one; and take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God, praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end, keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints, and also for me, that words may be given to me in opening my mouth boldly to proclaim the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains, that I may declare it boldly, as I ought to speak.

Sermon - Spiritual Warfare: The Enemy's Schemes

The Bible teaches there is an unseen realm populated by spiritual forces, both good and evil. In Ephesians 6:12, Paul refers to these evil powers as "rulers," "authorities," "cosmic powers over this present darkness," and "spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places." Despite our many surface-level conflicts, there is a deeper, truer struggle—our battle against these dark spiritual forces, led by the chief adversary, Satan.

How can we prevail over these forces? The Bible's answer is clear: we need God's battle equipment. Beyond that, however, we must be aware of the adversaries' tactics. As Paul writes elsewhere: "We are not ignorant of his designs" (2 Cor. 2:11). Unfortunately, many Christians are naive about the enemy's schemes, and this makes them vulnerable to surprise attacks. When it comes to knowing the schemes of the enemy, let's ask: (1) Why should we? (2) What are they? and (3) How can we?

I. Why should we know the enemy's schemes?

- A. So that we would be prepared 1 Peter 5:8
- B. So that we would not be ignorant 2 Cor. 2:10-11
- C. So that we would not be misinformed. 2 Cor. 11:14

II. What are the enemy's schemes?

- A. Deception He tries to distort the truth. John 8:44
- B. Temptation He tries to allure you through legitimate desires. Matt 4:3; 1 Cor. 7:5
- C. Accusation He tries to condemn God, you, and others. Rev. 12:10
- D. Intimidation He tries to paralyze you with cowardice. Luke 22:31;

III. How can we see the enemy's schemes?

- A. Know the truth
- B. Stay alert
- C. Walk in the light

Discussion Questions

- 1. According to 2 Corinthians 2:11, why is it dangerous to be ignorant of Satan's schemes? Can you think of ways ignorance has led to unnecessary spiritual defeat in your life or in the church?
- 2. 1 Peter 5:8 says to "be sober-minded" and "watchful." What do these words imply about our posture toward spiritual conflict? How does spiritual alertness differ from spiritual paranoia?
- 3. Deception is one of Satan's primary tactics (John 8:44). What are some lies Christians are especially tempted to believe today? How can you develop discernment to detect them?
- 4. Temptation often appeals to legitimate desires (Matt. 4:3; 1 Cor. 7:5). Why does this make temptation so effective? How can we guard our hearts without rejecting the good desires God has given?
- 5. Accusation is another scheme (Rev. 12:10). How does Satan use guilt and shame to disrupt your relationship with God and others? How does the gospel answer these accusations?
- 6. Intimidation (Luke 22:31) seeks to weaken faith. What are some fears or pressures that cause Christians to shrink back from obedience or boldness? How can we respond when we feel spiritually overwhelmed?
- 7. Read 2 Corinthians 11:14. Why is it important to recognize that Satan can disguise himself as an angel of light? What are some subtle or "good-looking" forms evil might take in today's culture?
- 8. What does it mean to "know the truth," "walk in the light," and "stay alert" in practical, daily terms? Which of these three are you most prone to neglect, and what could help you grow in that area?
